Deacons

For any organization to function, there must be servants committed to the work of that organization. It is no different for the local church. The word "deacon" comes from the Greek word *diakonos* which is primarily rendered "servant" in our English Bible. Another word that is translated as "servant" in our English Bible is *doulos*, which is also sometimes rendered "slave" or "bondservant." However, according to *Vines Expository Dictionary of New Testament Words*, "*diakonos* views a servant in relationship to his work; *doulos* views him in relationship to his master." In other words, a *doulos* is concerned with his/her relationship with the master, whereas a *diakonos* is concerned with his/her relationship with the work set before them.

This brief exposition of some of the Greek words for "servant" helps us understand what role and purpose deacons played in the New Testament church. Unlike elders, bishops, or pastors, deacons did not play an administrative role in overseeing the souls of the local congregation (see Paul's conversation with the elders from the church at Ephesus in Acts 20:17-38). Instead, deacons were appointed for a specific work and, like elders, had certain qualities about them (I Tim. 3:8-13). In Acts 6, seven men were chosen to help with the daily distribution of goods to the Hellenistic widows. The apostles advised the church to "seek out from among you seven men of good reputation, full of the Holy Spirit and wisdom, whom we may appoint over this business" (Acts 6:3). While the word "deacon" or *diakonos* is not applied to these men, there certainly are some parallels to their qualities and the qualities seen in I Timothy 3.

For many years the North Beckley church of Christ has been served by deacons who have been appointed to complete certain tasks. We are thankful for these men and all they do to further the mission of our local church. These men were undoubtedly appointed to be these special servants because they were already servants at heart.




